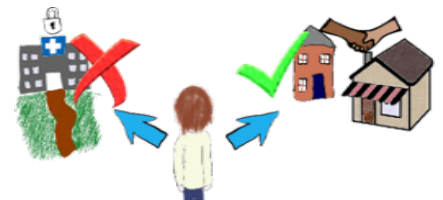


Government Asks

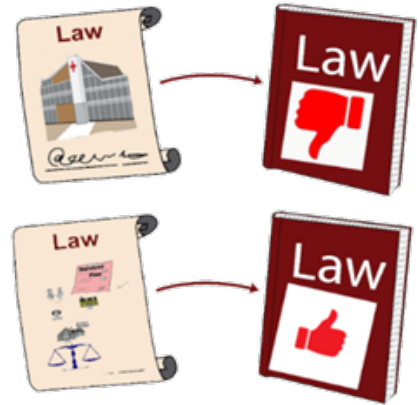
Mental Health Bill

We want to sign post anyone who is locked up in hospital or a struggling to get the support they need in the community, to get good legal support.

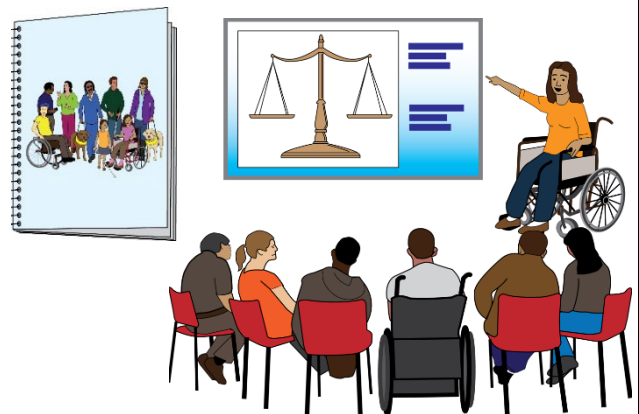
We will be working with Access Social Care and the Equality and Human Rights Commission.

We are making some guides and training, to help groups and individuals with lived experience think about campaigning.

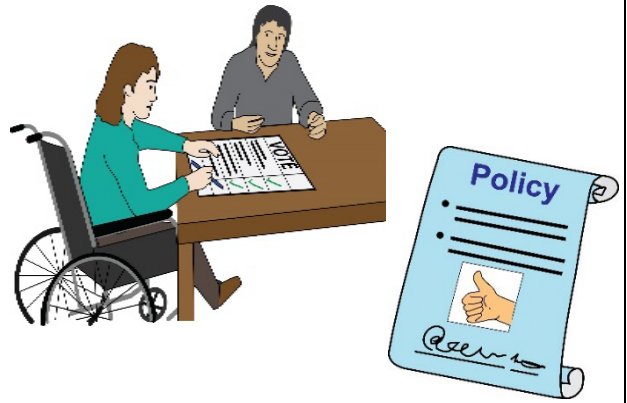
